

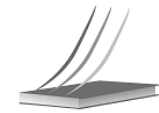

<u>PRIVATE SCHOOL AFFIDAVIT</u>	<u>PSP</u>	<u>HOMESCHOOL CHARTER SCHOOL</u>	<u>THROUGH SCHOOL DISTRICT</u>
<p>File private school affidavit between Oct.1-15 every year, list how many students and basic info on Dept.of Education website Note: Have another parent as an administrator for work permit purposes No testing required - CHSPE recommended</p> <p>PROS: Complete Freedom Can arrange own graduation schedule & have control over what classes to take when Can create a transcript tailored towards goals</p> <p>CONS: No educational funding from the state No guidance counselors - parent does it all Parent has to keep all academic records Parent has to create transcript & diploma (or pay a service out of pocket) A-G courses could be harder to "prove" to colleges</p>	<p>Private umbrella school filing the private school affidavit for a few or many homeschoolers</p> <p>PROS: Makes it less obvious who is a homeschooler because of more students More freedom than public options, but less than own private school affidavit School takes care of academic records Sometimes provide some sports or social activities</p> <p>CONS: Costs money for them to keep records, do diploma and transcripts No state funding for activities or classes A-G courses could be harder to "prove" to colleges</p>	<p>Several options - representatives here today from several schools - lots of program options Requires annual state testing</p> <p>PROS: Diploma from accredited CA public school Guidance from credentialed teachers & counselors Educational Funds for outside vendors More freedom than public school School takes care of academic records</p> <p>CONS: Oversight from a credentialed teacher with at minimum monthly meetings to provide samples & discuss progress Some schools require specific courses in specific years Courses have to be pre-approved Some schools limit the credits at CA Community Colleges</p>	<p>Hart @ Home - mostly self-study and online Go on local high school campus for labs etc. Requires annual state testing</p> <p>PROS: Guidance from credentialed teachers Students can participate in local school's sports Diploma from accredited CA public school Students can participate in local school's social activities like prom, games etc.</p> <p>CONS: No educational funding from the state for outside vendors Very little freedom Not very interesting work</p>
